Maianthemum canadense, Canada mayflower
Phegopteris connectilis, broad beech fern
Phlox stolonifera, *P. divaricata*, woodland phlox
Stylophorum diphyllum, wood poppy
Tiarella cordifolia var. *cordifolia*, running foamflower

Filling spaces – Dry, Acidic, Shade

Actaea racemosa, black cohosh
Ageratina altissima, black snakeroot
Eurybia (Aster) divaricata, white wood aster

For the Sun

Arctostaphylos uva-ursi, bearberry
Comptonia peregrina, sweet fern
Geum fragaroides, barren strawberry
Packera obovata, running groundsel
Rhus aromatica, fragrant sumac
